Collection Summary

One of seven brothers, Edward F. Fisher was born on February 23, 1891 in Norwalk, Ohio. He attended the Andrew F. Johnson Body Drafting School in Norwood, Ohio and began a career as a draftsman in his oldest brothers Fred and Charles' new Fisher Body Corporation—a successful automobile body manufacturing company holder of several U.S. patents—in 1909.

In May 6, 1916 he married Adeline Wink. The union bore three daughters: Sarah Jane Fisher Smith, Olivia Jane Fisher, and Belinda Jane Fisher Ford.

Fisher worked for thirty five years at the Fisher Body Corporation, in various tenures. In 1925 he became the vice-president in charge of production. In 1932 the company became a division of General Motors. Shortly after his brother's Charles retirement, Edward became the division general manager in 1934. In 1937 he founded The Fisher Body Craftsman Guild and in 1938 he created the national coach building competition sponsored by the Fisher Body Division. He became the vice-president of General Motors in 1940, finally retiring in 1944. From 1942 until 1969, he also served in General Motors' board of directors. He passed away on January 17, 1972.

He was an active member of Detroit's society, participating in clubs and association such as the Detroit Athletic Club, the Bloomfield Hills Country Club, the Detroit Golf Club and the Recess Club. His creative side came to be known when he authored or co-authored several books on the history of Fisher Body Corporation and Fisher Body Division.

Scope and Content of the Collection
